She has been a Diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine (ACVIM Cardiology) since 2021. During her residency, Dr. Larouche-Lebel contributed to numerous research projects focusing on the technical aspects of echocardiography, diuretic resistance, and the neurohormonal mechanisms of heart failure. She has co-authored multiple scientific publications in these areas. Dr. Larouche-Lebel currently practices at Daubigny Veterinary Center in beautiful Québec City, where she lives with her family and pets.
